Instagram can be a highly-targeted, visual advertising channel for your brand & the best way to up your game is to curate your feed, posting less while sharing high quality images.

This means being picky about what you are posting & selecting only the photos that tell your brand's story.

Sounds great, except; your photos look nothing like the ones you love on social media, you can't figure out how to make them look pretty & you can't hire a photographer to take every single photo! Well, let me help...

### **LET'S GET STARTED**

## TIP #1 - LIGHTING

Lighting is key, it is important to have good lighting, like any form of photography, no amount of filtering or app-editing will save a photo that's blown out, over exposed or poorly lit.

Whenever possible, shoot in natural light, but not direct sunlight. Walk around your house & take few test shots to help you decide where the best lighting is. I have a north facing window and it's perfect for most of my photo needs.

If shadows are a big issue for you, shoot on a cloudy day. It's like having a huge softbox which helps diffuse shadows and create fewer of them!



In this photo, the window is to my left side & I have used white foam board to fill in the shadows from the right side.

# **TIP #2 - COMPOSITION**

Second to lighting, composition can easily elevate your photos by following some simple rules! Composition refers to the way the different elements are arranged within the frame

1. Rule of Thirds



Two great starting points are:

When shooting with your phone or DSLR, turn the grid on to aid your composition & align your photos properly

## **TIP #2 - COMPOSITION**

### **Rule of Thirds**

### The rule of thirds is pretty simple.

You divide the frame into 9 equal rectangles/squares, 3 across and 3 down. Most camera & Phone manufacturers have included the capability to turn this grid on while shooting.

The idea is to place the most important element(s) of the scene along one or more of the lines or where the lines intersect. This is your main focus and what you want viewers to notice first.



### **TIP #2 - COMPOSITION**



### **Rule of Odds**

The Rule of Odds states that images are more visually pleasing when there is an odd number of subjects. The theory proposes that an even number of elements in a scene is distracting as the viewer is not sure which one to focus his/her attention on.

An odd number of elements is seen as more natural and easier on the eye!

### **TIP #3 - BACKGROUNDS**



Negative (Empty) space, oftentimes referred to as white space, is a concept that's been used in art, design & architecture for many years. It's equally useful in photography, and can be used to turn an average photo into a great one. The white space will bring chicness to your Instagram feed & make it look less busy and cluttered. This can be easily achieved using simple white backgrounds for your photos, be it a white table, a table cloth, wrapping paper or even plain foam board that you can find at the dollar store!

That being said, don't be afraid of breaking the rules every once in a while by placing a white object on top of a busy background which adds interest & variety to your feed.

# **TIP #4 - STORYTELLING**

Every story has a hero or a main subject, and every photo you take should tell a story; your story, your brand or the product you are trying to sell.

Like any good story there is a beginning, middle & end, and while not every post will be part of a mini series, taking your followers on a journey with you revealing bits & pieces of an exciting event be it a product launch, an impromptu trip or a family weekend is always interesting and engaging; for instance, this is part of a series taken on a Strawberry picking trip starting at the farm & ending on the kitchen table.



For Instagram purposes, think of your story in three, six or nine photos

### TIP #5 - PROPS

#### Experiment with different props and observe the way they enrich your story

You've heard it over and over again, a visually pleasing Instagram feed is one that has a consistent look and feel which you totally agree with but not sure how to achieve! One way to do that, is with your props; but wait, what do you mean by props? Photo props are the items beside your main subject that add to the story and dimension of the photo. For example, plants, spoons, plates, napkins...etc.

Think of them as an accessory complementing the main subject of your photo.



Selecting props that match your brand's colour palette and mood will help you achieve a consistent look & get people to recognize your photos right away, this is not to be confused by using the exact same props in every picture, but more like using different combinations of props with a specific colour and texture throughout your feed.

### TIP #6 - FRAMING

#### (when is doubt, shoot overhead)

If you are just starting out, shooting overhead photos or flatlays is a great place to start especially if you are only using your phone and not a DSLR. Flatlays are very popular on Instagram & frequently used by businesses featuring their products, foodies showing off their recipes & lifestyle bloggers showcasing their latest finds.

#### Flatlays are simple, chic and a creative way to display many objects at once.



# **TIP #7 - BREAK THE RULES**

There are no hard rules in composition, and while it certainly helps to know the tips in this guide, you should always trust your gut! So don't be afraid to think outside the box , have fun & break some rules when it feels right to you.
